The Surveys and Mapping Training Program will be held in WiikwemKoong Unceded Territory and will consist of 4.5 days of in- person training from September 15 - 19, 2025.

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

The field work portion of this Mentorship Program will be physically demanding, requiring the approved participant to traverse rugged terrain, and lift heavy surveying equipment. Approved participants will need to be physically capable of completing field work tasks.

Each participant will be required to bring the following items:

- Laptop (for in-class exercises)
- CSA certified work boots (for the field training)
- Weather appropriate clothing (for the field training, and boat tour)
